

Canadian ELD Provincial Enforcement Posture

June 22, 2021

The information provided below is a summary of guidance published by each of the Canadian Provinces and Territories regarding their approaches to enforcement of the new electronic logging device regulations that went into effect June 12, 2021 in Canada. The information includes their approaches to enforcement on intra and extra-provincial motor carriers, as well as relevant provincial web sites and contact information where available. This information was compiled from information listed on each province or territory's website available June 16, 2021 and constitutes the latest information available at that time.

STC will continue updating this document as new information becomes available but encourages interested parties to contact the appropriate provincial or territorial governments for the latest information. Many of the websites listed below contain additional information and FAQs that will be helpful to the motor carrier industry.
